## POPULATION GROWTH BETWEEN 2010 AND 2020

Between 2010 and 2020, California's population grew from 37.3 million to 39.5 million, an increase of $6.1 \%$. During the same period, the state's Latino population grew from 14.0 million to 15.6 million, an increase of $11.2 \%$. The increase in California's Latino population accounted for more than two-thirds (68.6\%) of the state's population growth during the past decade.

## GROWTH OF CALIFORNIA POPULATION GROUPS 2010-2020

The California Latino population increase between 2010 and 2020 exceeded the growth of other population groups.


## ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF POPULATION

Between 2010 and 2020, the Latino share of the state's population grew from 37.6\% to 39.4\%. In 2020, the Latino share of the population (39.4\%) exceeded the Non-Hispanic White share (34.7\%), with Latinos being the state's largest population group.

## AGE OF POPULATION: 2020

California's Under 18 Population: In 2020, 4.5 million Latinos were under 18, and 11.0 million were 18 and older. Over half (51.6\%) of all Californians under 18 are Latino.
Age of California's Latino and Non-Latino Population: In 2020, the California Latino population was significantly younger than the non-Latino population. More than one-quarter of Latino Californians (28.9\%) were under 18, compared to $17.6 \%$ of non-Latinos.


## CHANGE IN CALIFORNIA UNDER 18 POPULATION 2010-2020

Change in Latino and Non-Latino Under 18 population: Between 2010 and 2020, California's under 18 Latino population decreased by $5.5 \%$. By comparison, the non-Latino under 18 population of the state decreased by 7.1\%.


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## COUNTY AND CITY POPULATIONS: 2020

Census 2020 data reveal that all of California's 10 largest counties have significant Latino populations. The Latino share of these counties' population ranges from $23.4 \%$ in Alameda County to $53.7 \%$ in San Bernardino County. Nearly three in four California Latinos (73.8\%) live in these counties, with $30.8 \%$ residing in Los Angeles County. Additionally, nine of the 10 largest California counties are also home to the state's largest Latino communities, including the counties of Los Angeles, San Diego, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, Santa Clara, Alameda, Sacramento, and Fresno.

Most of California's 10 largest cities also have significant Latino populations. The Latino share of these cities' population ranges from $15.6 \%$ in San Francisco to $53.8 \%$ in Anaheim. Additionally, seven of California's major cities are also home to the state's largest Latino communities, including Los Angeles, San Diego, San Jose, Fresno, Long Beach, Bakersfield and Anaheim. The state's 10 largest cities are home to $24.7 \%$ of California's Latino population.

For all figures and charts, racial population group categories indicate the number of persons who identified only with that racial category - or that category "alone." Persons who identified with more than one race are presented in the "two or more races" racial population category. Persons who did not identify as White, Black or African American, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Asian or Pacific Islander, or two or more races are presented in the "some other race" racial population category. Persons who identified as Hispanic or Latino are presented in the "Latino" category only, and are not included in any of the racial population group categories.
