



2022 Midterm National Latino Weekly Poll – November 7, 2022

MAIN QUESTIONNAIRE

Methodology: On behalf of NALEO Educational Fund, BSP interviewed 532 Latino registered voters nationwide from Oct 25 – Nov 6, 2022. A fresh sample of 266 registered voters were added and combined with 266 interviews conducted in week 8 to create a rolling average of 532 for week 9. Interviews are collected every day through random selection from an online database of Latinos who are verified to be registered voters. The poll is available in English or Spanish at the discretion of the respondent and based on a national profile of the Latino electorate. Final data are weighted to match best estimates from U.S. Census for Latino voters with respect to state, age, gender, nativity, education and party affiliation. Each week the sample contains a margin of error of +/- 4.5%. Survey design and data collection are performed by BSP Research.
