METHODOLOGY

On behalf of the NALEO Educational Fund, BSP Research surveyed 800 Latino registered voters in California. The study was completed using a blended mode, where 600 interviews were completed on live telephone calls, and 200 were completed online via smart phone, tablet, or computer. Respondents were surveyed in English or Spanish, with the option available upon first contact. In total, 523 completed the survey in English, and 277 participants completed the survey in Spanish. The study was conducted from September 5 -12, 2024 and carries a margin-of-error of +/-3.5%.
