# AMERICA THRIVES WHEN IMMIGRANTS INTEGRATE AND NATURALIZE

With the proper tools and knowledge, immigrants can help our country achieve great things.

#### THE ECONOMY

#### Immigrants who improve their English language skills can triple their earnings, or better.

- On average, foreign-born workers who cannot speak English earn about \$22,000 a year.
- Foreign-born workers who speak English very well earn an average of about \$59,000 a year.

#### Naturalized citizens earn more than their immigrant counterparts.

• The average annual income of employed naturalized citizens is about 44% higher than the average annual income of working noncitizens.

#### Immigrants' increased earnings contribute to the economic success of all who participate in our economy.

• If 7.5 million immigrants naturalized within the next 5 years, our nation's GDP would increase by an estimated \$37-52 billion within the next 10 years.

#### THRIVING COMMUNITIES

#### Naturalized citizens are productive members of our communities and actively participate in our democracy.

- Latino and Asian American naturalized citizens vote at notably higher rates than their U.S.-born counterparts.
- Foreign-born residents have a lower incarceration rate than native-born Americans and their presence is associated with safer communities.
- Naturalized citizens safeguard our security as military service members, elected officials, and professionals occupying roles reserved for American citizens.

### **OUR GOVERNMENT SHOULD DO MORE TO INTEGRATE NEW AMERICANS**

#### Approximately 8.6 million lawful permanent residents are eligible to apply for naturalization.

• A majority - about 4.4 million - of them are Latino. Most of these individuals aspire to be U.S. citizens.

#### However, barriers to naturalization are persistent, and are becoming worse, including:

- High demand for accessible, affordable English and civics courses, which has resulted in long waiting lists and crowded classes.
- Rising costs of applying for citizenship and securing legal assistance where needed. In 2016, the fee for applying for naturalization increased from \$680 to \$725. This fee does not include the expenses of gathering documents and information needed to apply, nor of securing legal assistance with the application process.
- Growing application backlogs and wait times the average processing time for an application for naturalization ballooned from 5.8 months in FY15 to 10.3 months in FY17.

## CONGRESS MUST PROACTIVELY SUPPORT ACCESS TO NATURALIZATION AND INTEGRATION OPPORTUNITIES

#### Members of Congress should hold USCIS accountable for managing resources efficiently.

• Unfortunately, during FY18, USCIS's budget increased by 6% and overall application receipts declined by 13%, yet average case processing times still increased by 19%.

Members of Congress should co-sponsor the Citizenship Affordability Act, HR 3323/S 1862 (116th Congress).
