Report: California's Latino Population Has Grown More Than 11 Percent Over Past Decade

NALEO Educational Fund finds Latinos accounted for more than two-thirds (68.6 percent) of California's population growth since 2010, charts growth across state and within 10 largest counties and cities

More than half (51.6 percent) of all Californians under 18 are Latino

Washington, D.C. – The National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials (NALEO) Educational Fund released today its 2020 Census Profile of California, offering an indepth look at how California's Latino population has grown across the state and within its 10 largest cities and counties over the last decade. The report also offers a thorough look at population growth by age and ethnicity and features charts and graphics illustrating California's Latino population growth compared to that of the overall state population. According to the report, California's Latino population has grown more than 11 percent over the past decade, accounting for nearly 70 percent (68.6 percent) of the state's population growth between 2010 and 2020.

"Our 2020 Census profile of California highlights that Latinos had the largest growth of any population group in the state, which is why policymakers must ensure that addressing the concerns of the Latino community at every stage of the decision-making process is a top priority," said NALEO Educational Fund CEO Arturo Vargas. "Making up more than half of the state's under-18 population, Latinos are both the present and the future of California, poised to have an even bigger voice in the political process in the years to come."

Key findings include:

- Between 2010 and 2020, California's Latino population grew from 14.0 million to 15.6 million, an increase of 11.2 percent.
 - By comparison, California's overall population grew from 37.3 million to 39.5 million, an increase of 6.1 percent.
 - The increase in California's Latino population accounted for more than two-thirds (68.6 percent) of the state's population growth over the last decade.
- Between 2010 and 2020, the Latino share of the state's population grew from 37.6 percent to 39.4 percent. In 2020, the Latino share of the population (39.4 percent) exceeded the

- Non-Hispanic White share (34.7 percent), with Latinos being the state's largest population group.
- The Latino population is younger than other Californians. More than half (51.6 percent) of all Californians under 18 are Latino.
 - o In 2020, 4.5 million Latinos were under 18, and 11.0 million were 18 and older.
 - More than one-quarter of Latino Californians (28.9 percent) were under 18, compared to 17.6 percent of non-Latinos.
- In 2020, nearly three-quarters of California Latinos lived in one of the state's largest counties. In Los Angeles County, Latinos make up nearly half (48 percent) of the population.
- Seven of California's major cities are home to the state's largest Latino communities, including Los Angeles, San Diego, San Jose, Fresno, Long Beach, Bakersfield, and Anaheim. The state's 10 largest cities are home to 24.7 percent of California's Latino population.
